For example, D.Campbell had over a half dozen kits looking for a good home and E.Stevenson had a virtual museum of boat fittings available, some dating back to the fifties. I'm sure that I have forgotten someone that deserves mention, so to whomever you are, Sorry! Thanks to Dave Bros for the swap/sale idea. We'll do it again!

Radio Ramblings: During the first week of December, I made contact with over 70 club members in an attempt to formulate an up to date list of radio frequencies currently in use. If there was no contact made on the first attempt, each member was called a second time. If I missed you, I'm sorry. If you want to be added to the chart, please call me. (Info: in the event of conflicts, the club has matched pairs of substitute crystals for channels 61, 65, 70 and 90). For the guidance of newcomers, I will make the following personal

observation: Alphabetically, those almost always present at open boating were: Bishop, Kiriara, Kjellberg, McCabe, Olsen, Phillips, Simenson and Smith. Persistent Fairwind racers were: Flannigan, Flint, T.Johnson, Lysne, Peter and Trutwin, while the 914 races were mostly populated by: C.Bottemiller, T.Johnson, Klausler, Kraft, Midtbo and Peter. Builder's Corner: As 1995 approaches, we all start thinking of new projects. Maybe a new sailboat, tugboat or just refurbishing an existing model.

As the winter passes, I will try to explain, encourage, and maybe recommend a way of doing things that has worked for me. What you will read here will follow a series of building clinics at our monthly meetings.

If a particular topic is confusing to you, please call, and we will include it. In January, we will feature scratch building of boat hulls. Everything from planking, sandwich, fiberglass over foam, hot wire cutting, etc. We will be only touching on the basics but will answer questions and suggest where answers may be found.

The January meeting has always been a show 'n tell session, so bring your latest projects.

For those interested, the lighthouse and its island base are almost complete, and will be on display.

January "Hot Tip": Long burning *Miniatronics* 12 volt bulbs are available at Scale Model Supplies, 458 N. Lexington Pkwy, St. Paul (3 blocks north of I-94) (When there, check out their model railroad, Ed.) *Jeff McCabe*

Toy Boats Ahoy!: The toy boat show that took place in Albert Lea a few years back, and moved to St. Louis in '94, will be returning to the northland (Twin Cities area) in late April. The show has evolved into a model show as well, with almost half of the exhibits being R/C and static display models. (I'll report additional details as they become available, Ed.)

Year Around Sailing: No! You don't have to go to Florida, although that ain't a bad idea at this time of year! Chuck Bottemiller will have his new iceboat at the January meeting. He and Tony Johnson have been collaborating on this evolutionary step from Tony's design of last season.

Board Meeting, 11/15/94: D. Kjellberg called the joint board meeting to order promptly at 6:00 PM. All members of the '95 Board were in attendance, as were all members of the '94 Board with the exception of S.Rusk and R.Peter. Outgoing Treasurer, J.Bishop submitted "General notes on EMYC" for distribution to membership. He also advised that Hub Hobby has not paid for their newsletter ads which had been run four times. Hobbytown ad has run seven times, and has been paid. It was agreed that all future ads, if any, will be paid in full prior to insertion in the newsletter. Commodore asked for volunteer to assume duties of Treasurer. G.Phillips accepted the office. Group agreed on no newsletter, no meeting in Dec. J.Smith advised that he is mailing 83 newsletters to members, 7 to hobby shops, and trading 3 with other clubs. Cost is about \$.40 per copy, for a six page issue. Board agreed that this was not excessive, and to

continue six pages if there was sufficient input. City of Edina continues to graciously mail the newsletter for the club. D.Kjellberg mentioned that Hobby Warehouse (7126 Chicago) will order prepaid kits, radios, etc. at their cost plus 10% plus shipping. He also authorized the printing of six new color posters to be placed in hobby shops. It was discussed and agreed that new business cards should be printed without a contact telephone number imprinted. Any member that distributes cards to an interested individual or shop will ad his/her phone number to the card. This should prevent the cards from becoming easily out of date as in the past. P.Olsen volunteered to look into printing of new cards and a generic (no names) letterhead. J.Smith passed around a prototype of a membership frequency chart for comment. He was advised to proceed with it and publish it in the newsletter when available. Adjourn 6:35 PM

Organization

- Bylaws of EMYC and Articles of Incorporation of EMYC drafted by Tom Erickson on 8-18-92, on behalf of Dorsey and Whitney, 2200 First Bank Place East, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55402
- Articles of Incorporation, along with \$70.00 fee, filed with State of Minnesota on 8-24-92 to legally recognize EMYC as nonprofit corporation under Minnesota laws
- Application for Recognition of Exemption 501(c)(7), along with \$150.00 fee, filed with I.R.S. on 10-15-93 for EMYC to be recognized by the Government as a tax exempt nonprofit organization
- Copies of the documents listed above are contained in the EMYC file cabinet under "Club Formation"
- EMYC members elect president and other board members yearly
- Board members assign board positions (other than president position) amongst themselves
- Members are allowed to serve on the EMYC board for a two-year maximum time period

- City of Edina contacts are Tom Shirley and Barb Buie, [REDACTED]
- Tom Shirley or Barb Buie are to be contacted in advance for planned events or for the use of city's facilities

Financial

- EMYC is financial self-supportive
- EMYC checking account first opened at M [REDACTED]
- Checking account now resides with [REDACTED]
- M [REDACTED] Bank was bought by [REDACTED] and therefore the change, original [REDACTED] checks still honored
- Checking account number is [REDACTED]
- Checking account balance as of 10-31-94 was \$1,126.86
- Checking account does not draw interest
- Checking account ledger stored in the EMYC file cabinet under "Club Check Book"
- Board members cannot individually spend more than \$50.00 of EMYC's funds without general board approval
- City of Edina has agreed, in the past, to mail EMYC's newsletter at the city's expense

Record Keeping

- Yearly I.R.S. Tax Form 990EZ does not need to be filed with I.R.S. since 1) gross receipts (EMYC checking balance) does not exceed \$20,000.00 and 2) I.R.S. does not send to EMYC a pre-printed label on 990EZ Tax Form with instructions requesting completion
- State of Minnesota "Annual Registration of Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation" form (Minnesota statutes chapter 317A) must be completed annually. Form is sent to EMYC in late summer and must be completed and returned by December 31 of each year. Completed form is sent to: Secretary of State, [REDACTED] questions concerning completion can be directed to [REDACTED]
- EMYC file cabinet, located in Centrum building, contains all general records and documents

Membership

- Membership dues are \$10 youth, \$20 adult
- Membership runs for a period of one year
- Membership currently runs from June 1st of current year to May 31st of the following year
- Members joining after yearly Dry Dock Party are automatically enrolled as members for the upcoming (new) year
- Members Bill Bach and Tom Erickson were granted lifetime memberships at no charge
- Membership enrollment totals: late 1991-11, 1992-50, 1993-55, 1994-82

Operating Structure

- Monthly meetings held the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00PM (except December)

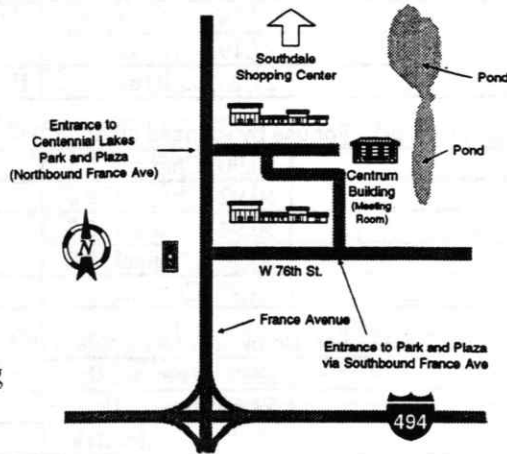
